Important: info updated for 2023

All rides are free of charge to join, but we do need to collect some basic details from you for safety and insurance purposes.

It would help hugely to speed up ride departures if you could please visit Rally HQ and provide your details at least 30 minutes before the ride is due to depart.

If this is not possible then you can still just turn up to the start point - you'll just need to provide your details to the ride leader.

Departure points are located along the fencing by the main tarmac road leading into the Rally: see site plan on page 10. Any changes made since this programme went to press will be displayed in the Rally HQ (where route details can also be found) and on each of the departure boards.

Riders must satisfy themselves that they and their machines are capable of the pace, distance and type of the organised rides, and that they can make their own way back if for whatever reason they cannot stay with the group. The Rally Committee, organisers and ride leaders can not be held responsible for riders who fail to do so, and we cannot provide any sort of sag wagon or pickup service, sorry.

Finally, please take great care to be courteous and give plenty of space to pedestrians on shared paths near the Rally - this really helps us to be seen by local residents as considerate guests on the Knavesmire.

09:00 Challenge Ride: The Tour de York

Join **Eamon Prendergast** of the **York Wednesday Wheelers** for this 68 mile epic ride encircling the city of York. At a brisk pace, riders will enjoy riding along mainly quiet roads and country lanes. There will be a refreshment stop. **Start point:** 5

09:15 The Tour of the Ainsty

Join Gary Knighton (York Rally Committee) for this 31 mile tour of the lowlands to the west which were known, historically, as the Wapentake of Ainsty. There will be a variety of surfaces and, as Gary says "There are some very green, green lanes." NOT suitable for road bikes with narrow tyres. Refreshment stop at Doyly's tearoom at Bolton Percy. The pace will be medium. Start point: 2

09:30 On road ride to Stamford Bridge

Andrew Richardson of York Wednesday Wheelers will lead this medium to fast paced 37 mile ride to the east of York to Stamford Bridge. Here in 1066, King Harold's army defeated invading Danes, and then marched south to fight William of Normandy. The rest is history! There will be a refreshment stop. **Start point: 3**

09:30 The Non-Conventionals!

Ian Prince (York Rally Committee) is leading a ride for tandems, tricycles, recumbent cycles, Bromptons, Moultons etc. Join him for a ride along the traffic-free Solar System Greenway and beyond, 5 miles each way, refreshments at Naburn Lock. **Start point: 5**

09:45 Easy ride to Riccall

Barry Raynor (York Rally Committee) will lead this leisurely 21 mile ride along a traffic-free track and quiet roads to the village of Riccall, where there is a tearoom. **Start point: 4**

10:00 Westwards with the Rouleurs

Mark Presley from York Rouleurs is leading this medium-paced 35 mile ride through villages to the west of York, calling at Doyly's tearoom for refreshments. All are welcome on this ride along quiet roads. Visit The York Rouleurs' stall at the Rally to find out more about this friendly and inclusive club. Start point: 2

10:30 The Solar System Greenway

Join Peter Huxford of York Greenways and the York Rally Committee, for this leisurely, traffic-free 17 mile ride along York's Solar System Greenway, visiting the Planets along the way. This former railway line is now home to a wealth of wild flowers and small animals. Start point: 5

12:30 The Way of The Roses

Bill Ramage is leading this leisurely-paced, mainly traffic-free ride along the York Riverside path and quiet roads to the Home Farm café at Beningbrough. The route follows part of Sustrans' Route 65. The Riverside Path is shared with people out for a stroll, so be prepared to take it easy! Beginner cyclists are especially welcome on this 23 mile round trip. (This ride will be repeated tomorrow) **Start point: 2**

13:00 RSF Ride: Dunnington and Beyond

Join George Nutt of The RSF Off-Road Cycling And Touring Club for this 26 mile ride to Stamford Bridge. There are lengthy off-road sections on farm tracks and bridleways. Enjoy quiet roads and interesting traffic-free tracks through lovely countryside. Start point: 4


Church service ride







Saving the Rally's bacon

In 2016, the second year after the York Rally was revived by its current team of voluteers, we faced a bit of a nightmare. It was Saturday morning, the Rally was in full swing, but the main catering company hadn't turned up.

Frantic phone calls having failed, we turned in desperation to the **Catering Perfection** van (left) which had been serving the nearby car boot sale since the early hours.

They almost literally saved the Rally's bacon, coming over and feeding Rally-goers for the rest of that day and Sunday too.

They've returned every year since as a mainstay of the Rally - extending their hours to include Friday afternoon and evening, and to early-morning breakfasts on Saturday and Sunday. They serve breakfast sandwiches, burgers, hot dogs, chips, hot and cold drinks, roast pork sandwiches and much more.

Our thanks to their whole team, and to all whose appetites continue to support their loyalty to the Rally!

Our sincere thanks also to **Caps Off Brewery** from Bishop Auckland, who stepped in at the last minute to run the Rally's bar in 2022 to cover for a COVID cancellation, and again at short notice this year after another supplier pulled out.
