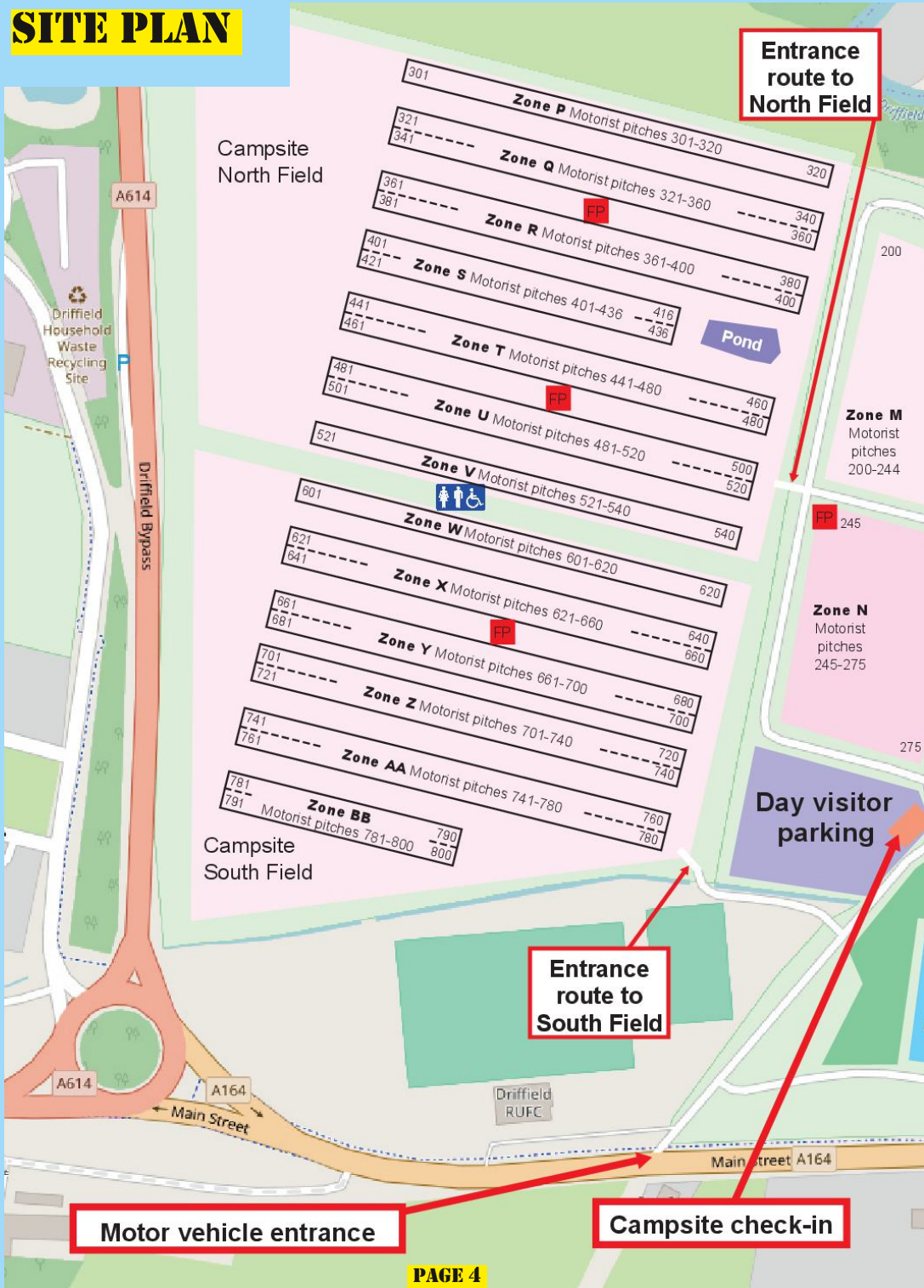

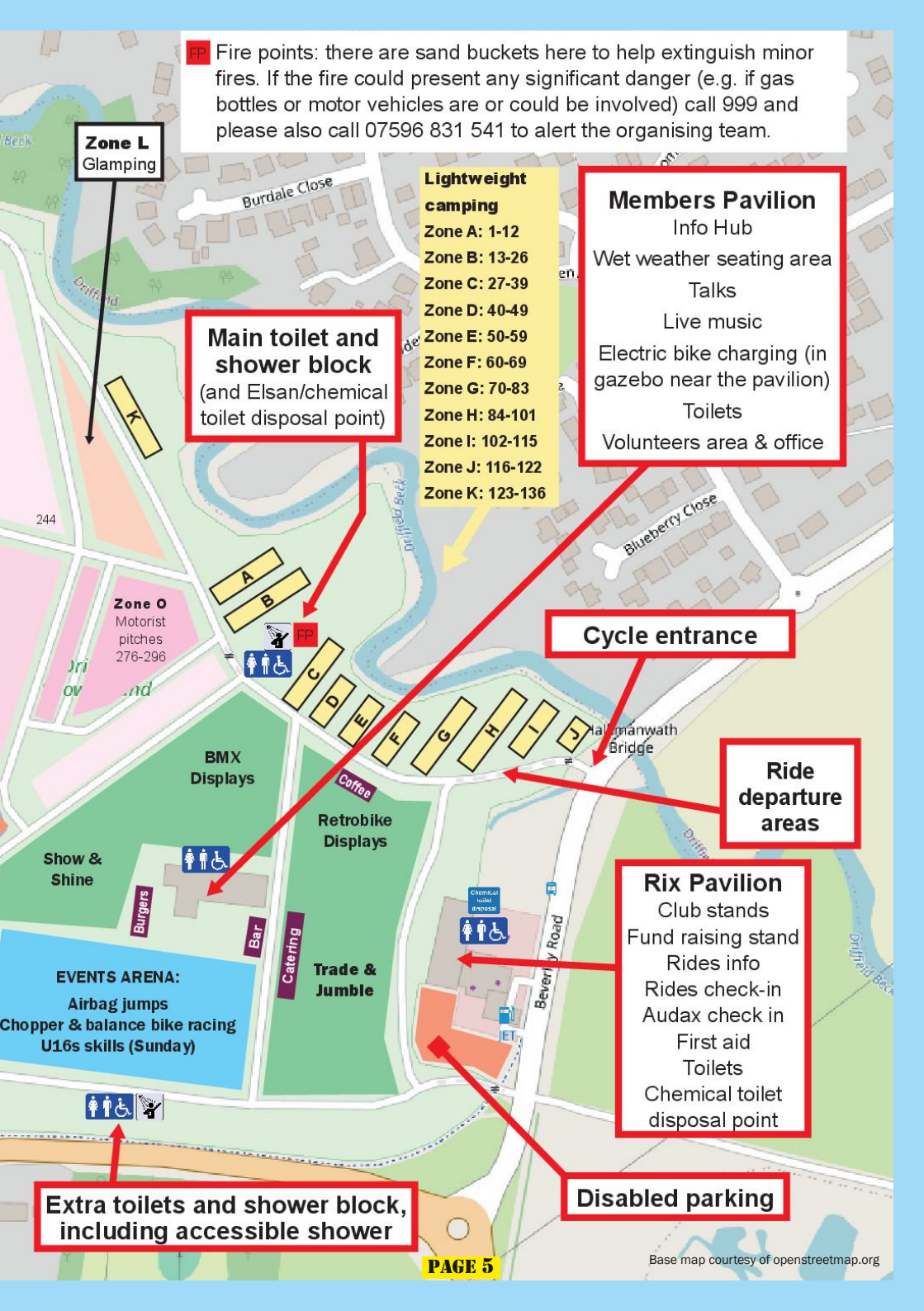

## General info

**IMPORTANT: Motor vehicle movements: Please keep vehicle movements to a minimum once on site and go DEAD SLOW. Note some roadways on site will be closed for safety and there is no entry or exit for motor vehicles at the 'cycle entrance' shown on the site map, page 4.**

### IMPORTANT: Lock it or lose it!

We have 24 hour professional security patrolling the site but please be aware that the event has been targeted by thieves in the past, and our people cannot be everywhere. Lock your bike securely - ideally with two different good quality locks, whenever it is unattended.

Metal barriers are provided across the site to secure your bikes, along with picnic benches in the lightweight camping area.

For campers, for extra peace of mind we recommend that if you have a car, caravan or motorhome you keep cycles inside the locked vehicle overnight for maximum security. If instead the cycle must be locked outside overnight, as an additional precaution you could consider removing the front wheel and storing that separately inside your tent or motor vehicle.

### Donating items to support the event

If you have any **sellable** cycling items (except clothing or complete bikes) which you could donate to support the Festival we would be most grateful. Details - see p. 18.

### Private bike sales

We'll set aside an area where visitors can chain cycles for sale to a fence. But to ensure we comply with trading rules, we must stress that this is for personal sales only please. Commercial traders must book a trade stand (enquire at the Info Hub).

## Lost property

Please hand in anything you find, or ask about lost items, at the Info Hub.

## E-bike charging

We are pleased to confirm that we can now provide an e-bike charging facility. This will be located in a gazebo near the Members Pavilion (see site plan, page 4). It will be on a first come, first served basis and e-bikes and batteries are left at your own risk - please lock securely.

## Showers

There are two sets of showers, in the main toilet block. Further showers, including an accessible shower, are in the "Extra toilets and shower block" near the events arena - see site plan, page 4. Please report any issues to the Info Hub.

# RIDES: FRIDAY AND SATURDAY

**All are welcome on our rides, free of charge, but please sign up in advance!**

All rides are free of charge to join (except for the Audax rides), but we need to collect some basic details from you for safety and insurance purposes.

**It would help hugely to speed up ride departures if you could please sign on to rides in the Rix Pavilion (see page 4) at least 30 minutes before the ride is due to depart, to fill out an emergency information form to give to the ride leader.** If this is not possible then you can still just turn up to the departure area and provide your details there.

Children under 16 years of age and vulnerable adults are welcome to participate but must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

## Friday rides

### **6.00 pm Fish and Chip rides to Hutton Cranswick and Nafferton**

The ever-popular Fish and Chip shop rides. One to Hutton Cranswick, led by Jools and Sally from the Driffield Four Seasons Breezers; the other to Nafferton and led by Festival stalwarts Peter Huxford and Ken Groom from York Greenways. Both rides will return after dusk, and so lights on your bike are essential. **Both rides leave from the rides departure area, see page 4.**

Any changes to rides made since this programme went to press will be displayed in the Rix Pavilion.

**Departure areas** are located along the roadway leading to the cycle entrance, by the lightweight camping: see map on p. 4.

Riders must satisfy themselves that they and their cycles are capable of the pace, distance and type of the organised rides, and that they can make their own way back if for whatever reason they cannot stay with the group. The organisers and ride leaders can not be held responsible for riders who fail to do so, and we cannot provide any sort of sag wagon or pickup service, sorry.

**Finally, please always be extra courteous to other road users and pedestrians when out on rides. This really helps us to be seen by local residents as considerate guests in the Driffield area.**

## Saturday: Rides

**8:45 am Skipsea & Mr Moo** Gary Knighton from the Festival team leads a 28 mile ride through rolling countryside to Skipsea, stopping at Mr Moo's for ice cream. **Departure Area 1**

**9:00 am Pocklington** Barry Raynor, with buddies from the Dronfield Clarion CC, will be leading this challenging 47 mile road ride to Pocklington. Barry says that some parts are hilly, and so it's not suitable for inexperienced riders. Refreshments in Pocklington. **Departure Area 3**

**9:00 am The YCF 100k Audax** Starts 9am after ride briefing at 8:50am. Registration with Audax UK is required either in advance, or, if spaces remain, on a first come first served basis at the Rix Pavilion from 8:30 am. Pre-booked riders should also sign in at the Info Hub from 8:30 am. Full route map etc. on the Audax UK website. **Meeting point: Rix Pavilion**

**9:15 am Wetwang gravel ride** Dave Hall from Seacroft Wheelers CC leads this 30 mile gravel ride to Wetwang. Dave says that there is a lot of off-road riding and so it's best suited to heavy duty tourers, gravel bikes and MTBs. Best to bring a snack, as refreshment stops are thin on the ground. **Departure Area 5**

**9:30 am Themed ride: Gypsy Race** Steve Woolcock and friends from the York Wednesday Wheelers are leading out along the route of the Gypsy Race, taking in notable prehistoric monuments on this themed ride. A must for history and geography buffs! 44 miles. Refreshments at Sledmere House. **Departure Area 2**

**09:30 am The YCF 50k Audax** Starts 9:30am after ride briefing at 9:20. Registration with Audax UK is required either in advance, or, if spaces remain, on a first come first served basis at the Rix Pavilion from 9 am. Pre-booked riders should also sign in at the Rix Pavilion from 9 am. Full route map etc. on the Audax UK website. **Meeting point: Rix Pavilion**

**9:30 to 10:30 am start times: MTB orienteering** with North Yorkshire Mountain Bike Orienteers. Course is off site. Details from NYMBO table in clubs area of Rix Pavilion, or via [www.nymbo.org](http://www.nymbo.org)

**9:45 am Themed ride: Hockney views** Another fabulous themed ride! This one visits viewpoints from which renowned artist David Hockney painted some of his greatest works. Led by Dave Bean from the York Wednesday Wheelers. 49 miles. Refreshments at Seaways Café, Fridaythorpe. **Departure Area 4**

**10:00 am Women and girls ride** Attention women and girls! Jools Turner from the Driffield Four Seasons Breezers leads to the fantastic Field House Coffee Barn. Registration required in advance via the "Let's Ride" website. Helmets are mandatory for U16s. 24 miles. Sorry, women and girls only. **Departure Area 1**

**10:15 am Burton Agnes Hall** A day out at Burton Agnes Hall! Peter Huxford and Ken Groom, from York Greenways, are leading this gently-paced 22 mile ride. The café is within the Hall grounds, and entry costs £12. Alternatively, there will be maps available for those who would prefer to have a self-guided return to Driffield. **Departure Area 3**

**10:30 am Family & beginner ride** Especially for beginners and families, Janet Harland from Bygone Bikes is leading this short, gently paced 5 mile ride around Driffield. **Departure Area 5**

**10:45 am Themed ride: historic churches** For those with an eye for architecture and history, John Harland is leading a 28 mile themed ride looking at historic churches in the area around Driffield. You will need to bring something to eat, as there are no cafés en route. **Departure Area 2**

**11:00 am Retro Ride (speedy!)** For those who feel that steel is real, love a frame made of 531 or Columbus tubing and relish a speedy ride on a vintage racing bike, Andy Cuming from Knaresborough CC is leading out this year's ever-popular Retro Ride (the speedier one!) 30 miles at ca. 13mph. Refreshments at Field House Café, Tibthorpe. **Departure Area 4**

**11:00 am National 400k Audax** Registration with Audax UK is required either in advance, or, if spaces remain, on a first come first served basis at the Rix Pavilion from 10:15am. Pre-booked riders should also sign in at the Rix Pavilion from 10:15am. Details & online entry on the Audax UK website. **Meeting Point: Rix Pavilion**

**Audax rides:** Kindly note that official entry is essential for these rides, either via Audax UK or on the day if spaces remain. If you are not entered, please do not ride the course.

### **9:00 am Off road to Thixendale**

Join George Nutt, of the Rough Stuff Fellowship, for this 43 mile ride to Thixendale and Fridaythorpe. George says that there is a lot of off-road riding and so it's unsuitable for road bikes. Refreshments at Seaways Café, Fridaythorpe. **Departure Area 3**

### **9:15 am Triking to Sledmere House**

Chris Goode of The Yorkshire Coast Clarion and the Tricycle Association is leading this 32 mile ride to Sledmere House. This is aimed at riders of tricycles, but others are welcome. **Departure Area 5**

### **9:30 am Martyn Atkins Tribute Ride**

A challenging 63 miler to Seaways Café at Fridaythorpe. Martyn was a much-loved member of the York Wednesday Wheelers, who died suddenly whilst cycling last year. He was a long-time supporter of the York Rally, and also Sustrans (now known as the Walk, Wheel and Cycle Trust) His friends, led by Murray Banks Walsh, are holding this ride, a favourite of Martyn's, in his memory. We hope that participants will make a

donation to the WWCT. Collection box in the Info Hub! **Departure Area 2**

### **10:00 am Kilham with the Breezers**

British Cycling Ride to Kilham, led by Jools Turner and Tracey Thomas of the Driffield Four Seasons Breezers. This 20 mile, easy-paced ride will go through gently undulating countryside. **Departure Area 4**

### **10:00 am The Non-Conventionals**

Dave Sharpe from the Festival organising team welcomes those on recumbents, hand-cycles, Bromptons, Moultons and any other non-conventional cycles to join him for an 18 mile round trip to Hutton Cranswick Farm Shop and café. **Departure Area 1**
